


## Q2 Which of the following settlements in Finderne do you most identify with? (Please tick the relevant box)













1	As a resident of Rafford I think Rafford Village Hall under its current group of volunteers really ticks all the boxes I can think of.
2	We are delighted with the local facilities
3	All the venues are too far away e.g. from where we are at Burgie - it is 2.5 miles to Kinloss Church Hall but to go to Rafford Church Hall (where we vote) is now a 10 mile round trip on a pretty degraded road. Its a 20 mile round trip from here to Edinkillie with fuel prices now ridiculously high, the car gets used as little as possible.
4	The area already has too many community facilities, each of which are competing for utilisation and the much-valued support of volunteers and very precious funds. Also, considering Finderne in the context of the wider Forres area community, there are a great variety of community facilities - no more are needed.
5	Not a hub - word doesnt mean much Edinkillie and Moray needs good rental homes. FDT should organise a housing association to buikld up to 12 modest homes for rent for local young couples and families in Edinkillie - Children for local school. In view of energy crisis, people should receive a one-off payment of £500 to lessen impact of soaring energy costs. FDT needs to address the dichotomy of Rafford and Edinkillie parishes.
6	Being able to borrow specialist equipment (perhaps for theatre or music performances for example) that can be shared between the existing spaces would be great
7	Enjoying the new activities at Altyre clubroom
